What help is available?

The early help and prevention team in Portsmouth can provide practical help and support early on, to stop problems getting worse.

We will talk to you about what might help and what we can do differently to help get things back on track. We will listen to you, work with you and do what we say we are going to do.

We will listen to you, work with you and do what we say we are going to do.

The help we can provide varies from family to family depending on the problems you are having. It could be help with getting children back to school and attending regularly, or help with finding work. You may have family members involved in crime or with addiction problems.

Some families will be struggling with all of these issues and more.

How the early help and prevention team work

We work with the whole family not just the children or a single family member.

You will have a main point of contact called a lead worker who you can contact when you want to talk about things or need practical help.

How long is it for?

We could be working with you for anything from a few weeks to a few months but this will be reviewed with you and your lead worker depending on your needs.

What if I don't want this help?

You don't have to use the early help and prevention service but you will still need to support your family to make things better. Talk to us and you can decide what help you need and we will work on a plan in the way you want.

What happens next?

Your lead worker will talk with you to understand more about your needs as a family and together you will agree an early help plan to outline the help and support you will get.
